

Esteemed and honourable Champion,

This letter is one of introduction by the fair and strong hand of Baron de Bestel. I, that same noble lady, do now wish to extend my thanks for your generous invitation, and to issue solemn regrets that at this time of turmoil, when the people of my own country are so watchful and wary for the actions of the agents of the hated Dumon, I am not myself able to meet your welcome. Nevertheless, I was touched and heartened by your kindness. You treated my cousins Camille and Leo with respect, and your discretion regarding their inquiries was admirable.

Therefore, I entrust to you some part of my fortunes and security, and I beseech your aid. I have sent this letter to you in advance of visitors. You will find this missive followed my child and my sibling, who will arrive at some time around five o'clock on the Saturday evening of your summit, and have been advised by your Civil Service to meet briefly with the Ambassador in the 'Hub'. I have pre-warned my people and you will find them unwilling to discuss matters in the presence of Tethros the Ambassador unless you are able to personally youch for his discretion.

I understand also that there may be some possibility to trade for goods, of the same kind requested by my cousins at the auction. I have sent my people with the means and resources to trade in kind, should you still be willing to sell to us. I hope dearly for this trust between us to grow further, and to one day have the opportunity to meet you and your most noble family myself.
